The reconstructed facility now has the capability to offer a wider range of programme offerings to include beekeeping, barbering, cosmetology, as well as food and beverage services, resulting in creating more job opportunities for youth and empowerment of women living in the community.

Approximately 70 persons including Mr. Donovan Stanberry, the Permanent Secretary of Ministry of Industry, Commerce, Agriculture and Fisheries on behalf of Minister Hon. Samuda, attended the ceremony.

Mr. Stanberry and other notable speakers in attendance expressed their appreciation for the support from the Government of Japan. They also alluded to the fact that the project has the potential to make a significant impact on the socio-economic development of especially the youth and women who now have better access to skills training and job opportunities to be provided by this educational and skills training facility.

Ambassador Nakano expressed his pleasure that the project had been completed in partnership with EU and HEART Trust/NTA, and he also highlighted that the provision of a modern vocational skills training institute in Northern Clarendon is one of the most valuable investment for Jamaicans to become self-reliant and achieve sustainable livelihoods.

Ambassador Nakano further expressed his determination to strengthen relations between Japan and Jamaica and that the Government of Japan would continue supporting projects which lead to economic growth in Jamaica.
