## The Project for Construction of Jamaica Foundation Lifelong Learning

The handing over ceremony was held at the Adult Education Center managed by HEART Trust / NTA, in Kingston on Monday, May 13, 2019. Through our Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Project, the new classrooms were officially handed over to the HEART Trust / NTA.

Ambassador Yamazaki noted that he is pleased to note that Japan has partnered with Jamaica in executing this project to install the better educational access for adult learners not only in Kingston but also from many other parishes for boosting Jamaica's socio-economic development. There was the change in the structure of the Jamaican Foundation for Lifelong Learning which has been merged with the HEART Trust / NTA, and the project was officially handed over to the HEART Trust / NTA. Ambassador expressed confidence that the HEART Trust / NTA will continue to be proactively engaged in activities that promote the continuation of literacy education and vocational training. He hoped that every adult learner can get the best educational opportunity as Education is the premise of progress, in every society and in every family. The Chairman, of the HEART Trust / NTA, Mr. Edward Gabbidon expressed the signal of honour and his appreciation for the significant support towards the education sector provided by the Government of Japan to add the value to Jamaica's development. He noted that the literacy and numeracy is essential base for educational progress and lifelong development therefore he extended his gratitude for this partnership.
