JAPAN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AGENCY (JICA), EMBASSY OF JAPAN, THE GOVERNMENT OF JAMAICA AND THE EMBASSY OF BRAZIL ANNOUNCE THE APPROVAL OF A TRIANGULAR TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROJECT "CAPACITY BUILDING ON THE COMMUNITY POLICE – KOBAN SYSTEM" TO STRENGTHEN JAMAICAS' NATIONAL SECURITY & SAFETY

Today, 8th June 2023, the Embassy of Japan and the Embassy of Brazil in Jamaica informed that they will be working collaboratively with the Government of Jamaica to deliver a Technical Cooperation Project entitled "Capacity Building on the Community Police – KOBAN System" which was proposed by the Ministry of National Security of Jamaica, based on the list of priorities presented by the Jamaican Government. Implemented by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Kingston for Japan's side and the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) for Brazil's side, the project will strengthen the Jamaica Constabulary Force community policing capacity. Japan and Brazil have had a longstanding experience of cooperation in community policing, which is exemplified in the Sao Paulo community policy system that was built on the traditional Japanese community policing "KOBAN system". This will be the basis for providing this capacity building support to the Jamaica Constabulary Force. This triangular technical cooperation project will be launched in 2023 with a cooperation period of three years, through to 2026.

For the Hon. Dr. Horace Chang, CD, MP, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of National Security, "the Government of Jamaica is committed to making the Jamaican society secure, cohesive and just. I am confident that this triangular cooperation will further strengthen the capacity of the Community Safety and Security mandate of the Jamaica Constabulary Force and thereby bolster our efforts to maintain public order and safety across the island. The Effective partnership is critical to this process. I wish to express gratitude to the Governments of Japan and Brazil for partnering with the Government of Jamaica through this technical cooperation that will positively impact the national security landscape in Jamaica"
